

Modern Slavery Act statement

This statement has been published in accordance with the Modern Slavery Act 2015, which requires all organisations, regardless of the sector, which supply goods or services and which carry on a business or part of a business in the United Kingdom and whose global turnover exceeds £36 million, to publish an annual slavery statement on their website.

Although Clear Engineering Recruitment Limited does not currently meet this turnover threshold, as a company we are committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in our supply chains or in any part of our business.

Company structure

Clear Engineering Recruitment Limited supplies recruitment services to clients, providing placements for individuals in the industrial, manufacturing and building sectors. We are based in Bromley and have 4 directors and an employee.

Supply chains

Our supply chains include sourcing candidates for clients. We expect our own suppliers to strive for high ethical standards.

Should a supplier's compliance with the Act be considered to be unsatisfactory, we will review our continued relationship with that supplier to ensure the company's own continued compliance with the Act.

We are committed to investigating any allegations of modern slavery or human trafficking, whether in our own company or in our outsourced suppliers.

Training

As the company currently only has [one] employee, we do not currently have the need for a whistleblowing policy or specific training, although the need for both will be kept under review as the business expands, to ensure staff have an awareness of the risks and to enable them to identify potential areas of concern.

This statement will be reviewed annually by our board of directors.
